How?

- Study the lists of open bugs and patches using [ProjectManagement](#).
- Pick one that you like, use the bugzilla *reassign* function to assign it to yourself so that others know that you're working on it (also add dev@cocoon.apache.org to CCs, otherwise the list won't get informed by your comments or changes).
- Close the issue if possible, or add meaningful comments telling others why you can't, ask the issue reporter for clarification, etc.
- If not closed, reassign the bug to dev@cocoon.apache.org so that others can have a look at it.
- Write a short note about what you did on the day's notes page.
