

# NightlyBuild

## What is a nightly build?

An automated process (a couple of shell scripts and a cronjob) runs once a day, retrieves the latest and greatest sources from CVS, and builds our software and website. There is no human actively overseeing this process, and hence these builds may be of very low quality (they may simply not run, contain bugs, crash your PC, or worse). Nightly builds are useful if you can't or don't want to use [subversion](#) yourself, but want to keep up-to-date on the latest bleeding edge developments. In addition, they are a useful debug mechanism for the excalibur developers.

## BIG FAT WARNING!!

Do ***not*** use nightly builds! They are preview releases *only*, and that's the only thing they're good for. If you do use nightly builds in an application, you are doing so at your own risk.
